Ijams' vision is that through direct experience with the outdoors all people will appreciate and care for the natural world.




Ijams manages 318+ acres of protected land.


When you volunteer, you help expand ljams' capacity and have a direct impact on protecting and caring for the natural world.








Before

A myriad of bird species have been seen at Ijams. Ijams is a favorite spot for migrating hummingbirds and songbirds as well as year-round residents. Bird feeder volunteers routinely clean and fill bird feeders at the Visitor Center and Ijams Homesite.








LITTER PICKUP

Ijams has 318+ acres, including seven parking lots and 12+ miles of trails, that get trashed! Litter pickup volunteers can come seasonally during regular business hours, check in and out at the Visitor Center, get tools, and pick up as much trash as they would like (check the ljams' website first for availability)!

Ijams is responsible for cleaning up a nine-mile stretch of the Tennessee River. River crew volunteers join the Ijams River Captain, traveling by boat and on foot to remove litter and debris from the river and its tributary creeks. Group river cleanup is available upon request.
